

Pets are allowed at Midway Red! The following table provides details about the pet policy.

How many dogs or cats are allowed?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two cats or two dogs or one cat and one dog in the lower apartment. • One cat in the upper apartment.
What about other kinds of animals?	You can substitute a rabbit or ferret for a dog or cat. Smaller animals such as lizards, snakes, rats, and hamsters don't count against the pet limit.
Are there limits to the animals allowed?	No wild animals or animals prohibited by the City (Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapters 198 and 200). The city prohibits the keeping of zoo animals, raccoons, and skunks.
Are there restrictions in the type of dog breeds allowed?	The company that insures the Premises bans Pit Bull Terriers, Staffordshire Terriers, Rottweilers, German Shepherds, Presa Canarios, Chows Chows, Doberman Pinschers, Akitas, Wolf-hybrids, Mastiffs, Cane Corsos, Great Danes, Alaskan Malamutes, and Siberian Huskies.
What documents do dogs and cats need?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One of the following documents proving ownership of the animal: municipal registration, a veterinary record, microchip records, or a pedigree registry with the name of the animal and your name. • A certificate of a rabies vaccine from their veterinarian for dogs and cats. • A City of Saint Paul license for dogs. • An insurance declaration page (DEC page) showing the owner has obtained renter's insurance that includes coverage of injuries and damage caused by animals for the period they expect to live in the apartment.
How does the pet qualify to live at Midway Red?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You provide the required documents for your dogs and cats. • Dogs and cats meet briefly with the Property Manager or Landlord and have their picture taken.
Are pet visitors allowed?	Only your pets are allowed on the Premises. No pet visitors are allowed on the property for any duration. Please arrange play dates off the property.
